Overview:

Tisch College and partners are seeking a self-motivated and resourceful AmeriCorps VISTA member to join our team. The Tisch Community Research VISTA will help shape and implement an initiative that builds the community research capacity of local nonprofit organizations as well as Tufts students and faculty. The primary goal is to better understand community problems and potential solutions through research that is antiracist in orientation, leveraging community based participatory and action research approaches.

The main components of this initiative are: (a) piloting a participatory research cohort comprised of students and an antipoverty focused community partner, (b) developing/supporting related workshops, and (c) developing/compiling shareable online resources. In conjunction with the Director of Community Partnerships and the Director of the Tisch College Community Research Center, the VISTA will help expand community-university partnerships in Greater Boston and help plan and launch the initiative.

About AmeriCorps*VISTA program:

VISTA members are committed to their mission to help bring communities out of poverty. Members make a year-long commitment to serve on a specific project at a university or nonprofit organization. The focus of their efforts is to build the organizational, administrative, and financial capacity of organizations that serve low-income communities. In Massachusetts, this program is administered through Campus Compact and AmeriCorps.

Job responsibilities:

- Help plan and pilot a community-student research cohort and related workshops for community and
 university stakeholders, bringing together new and experienced community researchers to share best
 participatory practices and antiracist frameworks to inform anti-poverty programs.
- Compile and refine resources and materials that culminate from the cohort and workshops into an online shareable format for a larger nonprofit, community, and university audience. Support the development of an online participatory research hub under Tisch website (https://tischcollege.tufts.edu/research/tcrc).
- Work together with the Tisch College Community Research Center Director and Directory of Community Partnerships to grow relationships with anti-poverty organizations in target geographic areas.
- Support opportunities to better leverage a new online community engagement platform for research partnerships (Give Pulse).

- Participate in TCRC steering committee meetings, Tisch College staff meetings, weekly check ins, and other convenings.
- Compile required reports as directed by the AmeriCorps program.

Primarily interfaces with: Tisch College staff, community organization staff, Tufts students, Tufts faculty. Reports to the Director of Community Partnerships and the Director of Tisch College Community Research Center.

- Background and/or interest in community-based participatory research, action research, Critical Race Theory, civic engagement, or similar concepts is also helpful.

This position will remain remote work while the university continues COVID restrictions to non-essential employees.
