JOB PURPOSE

Fifteen out of seventeen countries in the MENA and CIS regions have on-going school feeding programmes. In 2018, WFP directly reached 5.8 million children and their families in the region, which accounted for nearly 30 percent of all WFP school feeding beneficiaries' caseload globally.

In the past years, governments have started to recognize the multifaceted benefits of school feeding and what the programmes could achieve, beyond feeding children. Especially in crisis situations, emergency school feeding programmes had proven to be a critical safety net, directly supporting poor families during hardship. However, in most countries, the programmes have not yet been fully integrated into national social protection systems supporting the most vulnerable families and children.

Under the overall guidance and supervision of the Regional Programme Advisor, the successful incumbent will provide support to policy and programme activities of the School Feeding programmes in the region that effectively contribute to food security, nutrition, and education. This will be done in line with the corporate school feeding strategy and regional implementation plan/regional strategic priorities. The role will specifically focus on defining and amplifying WFP's contribution to SDG4 (as well as SDG 2 and 17) in the region.
