## **MAJOR RESEARCH INTERESTS**

My bio-behavioral research studies are interdisciplinary and include theory-based obesity prevention interventions, using the social-ecological model, with ethnically and socio-economically diverse populations in urban and rural communities, schools, and out-of-school environments. I currently serve as the principal investigator on multiple large-scale, community-based interventions that examine childhood nutrition and physical activity with the goal of improving the health of America's children, being intentional and strategic to reach those most at risk for obesity. I led Shape Up Somerville (CDC funded) which demonstrated a successful reduction in undesirable weight gain among diverse and underserved elementary school students through implementation of nutrition and physical activity interventions. My Live Well study (NIH funded) was a preventive intervention developed with active input from community partners to moderate or reduce weight gain among new immigrant women and their children. In partnership with Save the Children, I led the CHANGE study which was designed to improve physical activity and nutrition behaviors in rural communities in KY, SC, MS, and CA. More recently, my expertise as an implementation scientist has enabled me to lead research that uses systems science to understand the diffusion of intervention components in communities. Through the COMPACT grant (NIH funded), Tufts University, is working to understand "what works, for whom, and under what conditions" with respect to "whole of community" obesity prevention interventions.
