Nutrition Scientist

The Angiogenesis Foundation is a vibrant and growing global health nonprofit organization taking action to dramatically improve lives and catalyze an end to disease through angiogenesis, the process the body uses to grow new blood vessels. Since 1994, we have been pioneering new ways to promote health and advocating for people to have the best available disease treatments. We also work to educate key stakeholders from research institutions to healthcare organizations to governments about why the exploration of angiogenesis is vital for better health.

The Nutrition Scientist serves as the Angiogenesis Foundation's in-house nutrition science and scientific leader, advisor, and expert on the subject of food and nutrition across a broad range of disciplines and therapeutic areas. This is a full-time position that requires regular on-site interactions with other managers and staff, as well as travel to attend and participate in key conferences, events and meetings.

These subject areas covered by the Nutrition Scientist include: biochemical and molecular nutrition, angiogenesis, epidemiology, tumor biology/oncology, disease prevention, among other fields. Additional areas of coverage include: drugs/medical devices/diagnostics, clinical trials, regulatory approvals, post-marketing studies, and corporate and strategic intelligence.

The Nutrition Scientist also contributes to the Foundation's research programs, which include collaborative laboratory research, as well as business and market research.

As a critical requirement for the role, the Nutrition Scientist will be supported to continuously update his/her knowledge of scientific literature, and must identify, report on, and codify key findings, conduct briefings, work with internal staff and external stakeholders to provide expert support of Foundation programs and business development, and be available for on-demand research and analysis. All functions are structured according to company processes and policies, and guided by business goals.

Specifically, the Nutrition Scientist will:

• Support management with researched facts, data, evaluations and interpretations, and organizational strategy development related to the fields of nutrition and angiogenesis, including research, people, companies, public policy, events, and national and international issues.

- Support preparation of Foundation leaders for major public appearances (i.e., media, White House, TED, World Economic Forum, etc.), including research, fact checking, script drafting and review, and participating in planning and rehearsals.
- Lead the internal assessment of research opportunities presented to the Foundation.
- Design and oversee execution of market research and laboratory research initiatives.
- Prepare and oversee preparation and submission of manuscripts, abstracts, and posters for publication and presentation.
- Forge effective relationships with leaders in the nutrition and angiogenesis fields, including but not limited to scientists, clinical key opinion leaders, industry representatives, and government officials.
- Support program staff in the delivery of accurate science content (PR, social media, website content).

Requirements:

- Masters in Nutrition or Biological Sciences, PhD preferred
- · Nutritional biochemistry background preferred
- Experience and expertise in laboratory research is required, as is basic knowledge of biopharmaceutical research and development.
- A Minimum 2 years experience in academic research, biopharmaceutical industry, or consulting.
- Must have excellent oral and written communication skills, strong interpersonal skills, and the ability to perform independently.
- Must have demonstrated ability to apply scientific knowledge to achieve business goals.
- Strong data interpretation and basic quantitative and statistical skills are essential.
- The ideal candidate must be an independent critical thinker, detail- and accuracy-oriented, able to meet deadlines, and adaptive to short timelines and re-prioritizations, and be able to manage multiple projects in a fast-paced environment.

• The position involves travel nationally and internationally for conferences and events, estimated to be no
more than 20-30% of the time.
